I am pleased to announce that this year we can also cover the entire clinic with Chris. MDA will continue to bring these opportunities to our members with fees based on the health of our club's finances.

CONVERSATIONS WITH A VETERINARIAN

The Neurological Horse

Neurological disorders in animals manifest as many different signs and symptoms, such as seizures or paralysis. The challenge in diagnosing neurological disorders in animals is in accurately identifying the cause of the disorder so that appropriate therapy can be applied. When diagnosing neurological disorders, your veterinarian uses his/her knowledge of morphological and physiological features of the nervous system to determine the location of the disorder, the degree of damage and finally the cause. The signs associated with neurological disorders reflect only the location of the disease not the type of disease, but are important in helping diagnose the disorder. For example, seizures are cerebral (brain) dysrhythmias, but the causes of seizures can be from the brain tumors, injuries, toxins or even renal disease. Further diagnostic tests will help in determining the cause of seizures that will then lead to proper therapy.

Your equine veterinarian performing a neurological exam will be observant to all clues. This, combined with a good history from the owner, and signalment (breed, sex, age), will help with diagnosis of the disorder. History from you the owner is very important, as it may reveal a recent change in feed, accidental ingestion of a toxic plant or injury. Risk factors, such as signalment, may also be important. Below I've outlined some examples that illustrate how some of these "clues" helped in diagnosing some top neurological differentials in horses.

1. A newborn foal (that you missed the birth of!) seemed ok when you first saw it 2-8 hrs old but is becoming more lethargic and dull to his surroundings. Differentials: Lots here! Could be any of the following: septicemia, (failure of passive transfer-i.e. not obtaining colostrums within 2-4 hrs), dystocia/asphyxia during birth, herpes Type I, hypoglycemia, trauma, neonatal isoerythrolysis (immune mediated hemolytic disorder of foals absorbing antibodies in the colostrums), renal disease (ureter/renal defects). All of these can lead to a depressed mental state of the foal.
2. Your horse seems to be sweating abnormally in an area along his lower shoulder/neck region only (and it's not hot). Differential: very likely Horner's syndrome, a neurological condition in which there is a lesion in the spinal cord around the cervical or thoracic regions.
3. Your 5 yr old Oldenburg gelding has gradually over several yrs developed a worsening ataxia (incoordination) in his gait and seems to be moving as though he were drunk and sometimes stumbles, no fever. Differentials: Trauma, EPM, Rabies, Wobblers, Herpes, ingestion of a toxic plant, or possibly cerebellar abiotrophy (a hereditary trait seen in some Arabians, Oldenburgs and Gotland ponies).
4. Your 3 yr old thoroughbred colt seems to be spastic, particularly in the front limbs. He moves more short strided and somewhat stiff, no fever. You've noticed this over several months. Differentials: Same as above. In both of these cases however the longer progression of signs points less towards an infectious process (rabies, herpes) or ingestion of a toxic plant.
5. Your 9 yr old (nonpregnant) mare and 18 yr old gelding have come in from the field shaking and somewhat incoordinated (the gelding seems worse). You've just turned them out 5 days ago to your fresh ryegrass/fescue field (it is June). Differential: most likely ryegrass staggers, but should also not discount organophosphate, metaldehyde, or lead poisoning.
6. Your normally easy going 12 yr old mare has become somewhat cranky over the past week and over the past 2 days seems to be trying to viciously attack the barn cat and dog that she normally ignores. She also pins her ears back at you and threatens to kick and bite you, but is sullen if left alone. She is normally turned out in the evenings (summer time) and is in a large field in the country with 6 other horses-they seem fine. Differential: I'd strongly suspect rabies. Get your vet out soon to evaluate as others (humans included) are at risk.

So did you have fun on these? Neurological disorders/diseases can be challenging and need to be fully evaluated. Enjoy the rest of your warm days-cool days are coming!

All members (and friends, relatives, or neighboring trash piles) need to do is save the proofs of purchase from bags of Reliance, Legends, or Triple Crown horse feeds. Reliance proofs are worth 10 cents each; Legends and Triple Crown are worth 25 cents each. (If you get feed delivered in bulk, we'd need the original receipts, but I'd be happy to make copies to return! Bulk Reliance purchases are worth \$4/ton, and bulk Legends are worth \$10/ton.) While that doesn't sound like a lot of money, it builds up very quickly. A very few people in a club I used to be associated with could raise between \$500 and \$700 a year!

Scott and I will collect the proofs. Feel free to hand them to us at any MDA function, or mail them to us (5135 Meadowstream Garth, White Hall, MD 21161) when you get a collection. If you have a big pile of bags collecting in the corner of your barn, we'll even come clip out the proofs. The year for the SHOW program runs from July 1 - June 30, so this is the start of a new year for us.

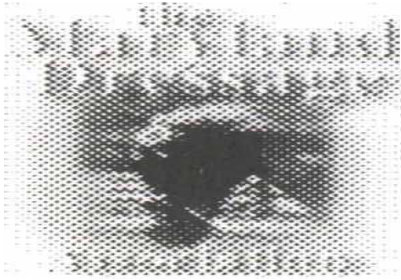

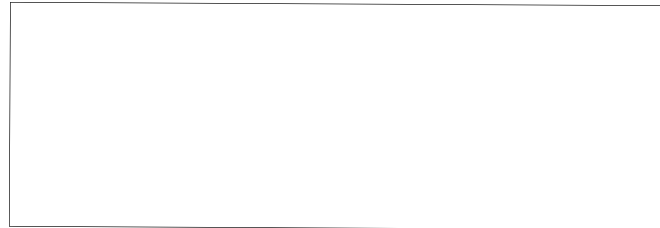
